Repelling Seagulls for the Highland Council

The Highland Council area in the Scottish Highlands is the largest local government area in the United Kingdom and the seventh most populous.

With some 4,905 kilometres of coastline it's unsurprising to learn that the area has more than its fair share of seagull visits. In some populated areas these seagulls had become a problem to the Council. In search of food they regularly removed the contents of small waste/litter bins, scattering garbage far and wide.

In addition to being an eyesore, and a potential health and safety hazard the litter was time consuming to clear up and became almost a never-ending task.
